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
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
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MAP OF HONG KONG ISLAND, KOWLOON AND NEW KOWLOON SHOWING CENSUS DISTRICTS



Section 1: CLIMATE AND GEOGRAPHY

Hong Kong is on the south-east coast of China, adjoining the province of Kwangtung. It is just inside the tropics, about 130 kilometres south of the Tropic of Cancer, and lies between latitudes 22°9′ and 22°37′N and longitudes 113°52′ and 114°30′E. The twin cities of Victoria on Hong Kong Island, and Kowloon on the mainland, stand on either side of the harbour, and are about 130 kilometres south-east of Canton and 65 kilometres east of Portuguese Macau.

The total land area of Hong Kong is 1,052 square kilometres of which Hong Kong Island itself, together with a number of small adjacent islands, comprise 78 square kilometres. Kowloon and Stonecutters Island comprise another 51 square kilometres. The New Territories, which consist of part of the mainland and more than 230 islands, have a total area of 923 square kilometres.

Hong Kong enjoys a variety of weather from season to season unusual for tropical countries. The winter monsoon normally begins during September and prevails from October to mid-March and occasionally to May. Early winter is the most pleasant time of the year. The summer monsoon occurs from mid-April to September but is not so persistent. Summer is the rainy season and is almost continuously hot and humid.

Statistics of meteorological observations are taken from the records of the Royal Observatory. They refer to observations made at the Royal Observatory, except in the case of evaporation, sunshine and the instantaneous intensity of rainfall which are derived from its King's Park Station.

The normals for various meteorological items refer to the averages during the period 1947–1976.

Areas of various census districts are obtained from the Public Works Department.

Information on land utilization is supplied by the Agriculture and Fisheries Department.

Section 2: POPULATION AND VITAL STATISTICS

Statistics on socio-economic characteristics of the population in Tables 2.1 to 2.9 are obtained from the various population censuses.

Statistics relating to live births and deaths refer to known occurrences of such events. Statistics relating to marriages refer to such events as were registered with the Registrar General during the period covered. The figures include marriages performed at the official registries and at licensed places of public worship; they include also marriages other than first marriages.

Population projections are extracted from the publication entitled Hong Kong Population A 20-Year Projection.

A domestic household comprises related family members and unrelated persons, if any, such as friends, servants or hired hands, who live together under the same roof and share the household food.

Monthly household income is defined as follows:

- a. for the 1971 Census The total monthly receipts of all members of the household from all sources, whether earned (salaries, commissions and earnings from part-time work, but excluding annual bonuses), unearned payments (dividends, interest, rent, remittances, pensions, etc.) or profits from the household's own business. The income figures for the marine census refer to December 1970 and for the land census to January 1971.
- b. for the 1976 By-census Sum of personal incomes (consisting of earnings in cash from main employment and other cash income) of persons aged 12 or over who were found to be in the household during the reference night. For an employer or self-employed, earnings excluded expenses incurred in running the business. For an employee, the amount earned included salary or wages, commissions, bonuses, overtime, tips and other cash allowances except housing allowance. The income figures for the marine census refer to May and for the land census to July 1976.

Figures on working population, economically active population and age-sex specific labour force participation rates in Tables 3.1 to 3.7 are obtained from the various population censuses.

Economically active population is defined as follows:

- a. for the 1961 Census All persons aged 6 and over who had been working 40 hours or more during the 20 days ending on Census Eve. This included unemployed persons between the age of 15 to 64 who had previously had paid employment but did not work 40 hours or more during the 20 days ending on Census Eve, and those aged 15 and over who were looking for their first job.
- b. for the 1966 By-census All persons aged 5 and over who had been working 40 hours or more during the 20 days preceding Census Day. This included unemployed persons between the age of 15 to 64 who had previously had paid employment but did not work 40 hours or more during the 20 days preceding Census Day, and those aged 15 and over who were looking for their first job.
- c. for the 1971 Census All persons aged 10 and over who were engaged in productive work for at least 15 hours during the seven days before enumeration (the hour criterion did not apply to farmers and fishermen). This included persons aged 15 to 64 who would have been engaged in productive work but were currently unemployed and those in the same age-group seeking work for the first time.
- d. for the 1976 By-census All persons aged 14 and over who were engaged in productive work for at least 15 hours during the seven days before enumeration (the hour criterion did not apply to out-workers, self-employed, unpaid workers, farmers and fisherfolk) or who were on leave; and persons aged 15 to 64 who would have been engaged in productive work but were currently unemployed.

Statistics of employment in the mining and quarrying; manufacturing; electricity and gas industries are obtained from quarterly surveys. Before 1974, coverage for the manufacturing sector was limited to establishments registered with or recorded by the Labour Department only. Since December 1974, the coverage has become complete.

For building and construction, figures are obtained from quarterly surveys of building and construction work sites and refer to employment in construction work sites. The statistics cover all manual workers of all types participating in site work but exclude professional, administrative and clerical staff of construction companies.

Statistics of employment in the wholesale, retail and import/export trades, restaurants and hotels are obtained from quarterly surveys. The register of establishments which engaged in these trades is maintained by reference to records of the Business Registration Office of the Inland Revenue Department, the Urban Services Department and Housing Department. The register excludes hawkers, street vendors, retail pitches (other than market stalls) and canteens in plants and offices.

Statistics of employment in selected trades of the transport, storage and communication sector as well as community, social and personal services, and in the financing, insurance, real estate and business services are compiled from quarterly surveys covering establishments registered in the Business Registration Office of the Inland Revenue Department and other organizations such as the Hong Kong Law Society, Hong Kong Barrister Association and Hong Kong Society of Accountants.

For transport, storage and communication and community, social and personal services, the coverage is as yet incomplete. Major expansions of coverage for these statistics occurred in 1970, 1976 and 1977. There was also a major expansion of coverage for financing, insurance, real estate and business services in 1973. Complete coverage was attained in 1975.

An 'establishment' is defined as an economic unit which engages, under a single ownership or control, in one (or predominantly one) kind of economic activity at a single physical location. 'Persons engaged' refer to working proprietors, active business partners, unpaid family workers and all employees of the establishment who are either at work for pay or profit, or are temporarily absent from work, i.e. on short-term leave such as sick leave, casual leave or paid vacation. Excluded are outworkers and persons on indefinite lay-off and on pension. Part-time and casual employees and unpaid family workers who worked for less than one third of the normal working time on the reference date of the survey are also excluded.

The classification of establishments is based on the United Nations International Standard Industrial Classification (1968) published in U.N. Statistical Papers Series M, No. 4, Rev. 2.

Statistics of employment in government service are compiled from quarterly returns made by government departments. Classification of government departments and sections by purpose is based on the System of National Accounts classification for government expenditure with some modifications.

Indexes of average daily wages are compiled half-yearly by the Census and Statistics Department. The wage indexes are weighted by the number of workers employed in the month indicated and measure the percentage changes in average daily wages since the base period. The index of nominal wages measures the changes in the amount of money earned as wages, while the index of real wages measures the changes in the purchasing power of money earned as wages. The real wage index numbers are calculated by deflating the nominal index numbers by the average monthly Consumer Price Index (A) for the previous six months.

Statistics on reported accidents and stoppages are supplied by the Labour Department.

Reported accidents refer to all accidents reported to the Labour Department which have resulted in the death of a workman or the total or partial incapacity of a workman for more than three days. It should however be noted that a discontinuity occurred in the period 1970–72. Figures for these years related only to accidents which occurred in industrial undertakings or which arose out of industrial work.

Stoppages refer to number of work stoppages and the corresponding number of working days lost through these stoppages, analysed according to major divisions of the International Standard Industrial Classification. Stoppages of work are those which arise from trade disputes connected with employment, non-employment, terms and conditions of employment. Stoppages involving fewer than ten workers or lasting less than one day are excluded, unless the aggregate of working days lost exceeds 100. The number of workers involved is the number who actually cease work at the establishments where the disputes occur.

Section 4: INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION

The 1973 Census of Industrial Production was a full scale survey conducted during 1974 to collect information from industrial establishments in respect of the year 1973. The Census covered production activities in mining and quarrying; manufacturing; and the supply of electricity; gas and water. Industrial establishments engaging 10 persons or more were fully enumerated whereas for establishments engaging less than 10 persons, a random sample of approximately 1 in 10 was selected. This Census was the first in a series of annual enquiries designed to provide a continuous and systematic description of the industrial sector. Because of resource constraints, the Census of Industry for 1974 and 1975 was confined to establishments engaging 10 persons or more in the textiles and clothing industries only. In 1977, the 1976 Census of Industry was conducted. Industries covered were the same as those in the 1973 Census. Establishments engaging 100 persons or more were all enumerated, and a random sample of those engaging less than 100 persons was also selected for enumeration.

Statistics of textile production in Tables 4.10-4.12 are compiled from quarterly returns submitted by establishments classified to the spinning and weaving industries on the Register of Manufacturing Establishments maintained by the Census and Statistics Department. Establishments engaging less than 20 persons are selected on a sample basis. Production of similar items by establishments outside the spinning and weaving sectors are not included. The old series of textile production statistics

was discontinued since the first quarter of 1975.

The output of mines is supplied by the Commissioner of Mines and that of electricity and gas by the public utilities companies. Statistics of cement production are supplied by the cement manufacturing companies; and statistics on water consumption by the Water Supplies Department of the Public Works Department.

Section 5: FOOD SUPPLIES

Statistics of rice supplies are provided by the Trade, Industry and Customs Department. The intakes, off-takes and stock figures refer to the position at the godowns.

Statistics of live animals slaughtered and supplies of fresh vegetables and fresh fish are provided by the Agriculture and Fisheries Department. They refer to quantities available for sale, except in Table 5.1 where they refer to the net quantities available for consumption.

Section 6: EXTERNAL TRADE

External trade statistics comprise movements of cargo between Hong Kong and other trading partners, by land, air and water and to a limited extent by post, with the exception of the following classes of goods:

1. Transhipment cargo under through bill of lading or through air way-bill;

2. Transit cargo;

3. Articles imported or exported by the armed forces of the Crown;

4. Ships' stores, including bunker fuel; aircraft stores, including aviation fuel;

5. Personal baggage and possessions of travellers, not including motor vehicles;

- 6. Advertising materials supplied free of charge and samples of no commercial value or valued at less than five hundred dollars:
- 7. Marine fish arriving direct from fishing grounds on fishing craft registered or licensed in Hong Kong;

8. Gifts of a personal nature where no payment has been made by the receiver;

- 9. Articles temporarily imported and exported solely for exhibition and subsequent return;
- 10. Articles imported or exported under and in accordance with an A.T.A. carnet;

11. Circulatory used freight containers and the like;

12. Banknotes after issue into circulation, being legal tender in any country.

The trade accounts relate to movements of merchandise only, and do not include those of bullion and specie.

Imports are c.i.f. values, exports and re-exports are f.o.b. values.

Imports are goods which have been produced or manufactured in places outside the jurisdiction of Hong Kong and brought into Hong Kong by land, air or water for whatever purpose.

Exports from Hong Kong are the natural produce of Hong Kong or the products of a manufacturing process in Hong Kong which has changed permanently the shape, nature, form or utility of the basic material used in manufacture.

Re-exports are products which have previously been imported into Hong Kong and which are re-exported without having undergone in Hong Kong a manufacturing process which has changed permanently the shape, nature, form or utility of the product.

The trade index numbers are compiled from value and quantity data as published in the Hong Kong Trade Statistics. The unit values for domestic exports are on an 'f.o.b. – free-on-board' basis while those for imports are on a 'c.i.f. – cost, insurance and freight' basis.

The unit value for each commodity classification item is the quotient of the value over its corresponding quantity. As such, the unit value series (as opposed to market prices) are not free of the effect of change, especially improvements, in quality or of change in product mix included within a commodity classification.

Quantum index numbers are derived by dividing the value index numbers by corresponding unit value index numbers; and as a result are derived as a residual and subject to the limitations mentioned above. The unit value index numbers are base-weighted while the quantum index numbers are current-weighted.

The terms of trade index is the ratio of unit value index for domestic exports to that for imports.

For inclusion in the compilation of the trade index numbers, 471 items out of a total of 1,144 items for domestic exports and 1,046 out of 2,129 for imports are selected. In terms of value, the selected items accounted for 72 per cent and 80 per cent for domestic exports and imports respectively in the base year 1973.

Section 7: PRICES AND HOUSEHOLD EXPENDITURE

The average retail prices of the principal foodstuffs are obtained by price investigators from market stalls and shops throughout Hong Kong during the period specified.

The average wholesale prices of rice are supplied by the Trade, Industry and Customs Department, while those of live pigs,

live cattle, fresh marine fish and fresh vegetables are supplied by the Agriculture and Fisheries Department.

The old series of consumer price indexes consists of the General Consumer Price Index and the Modified Consumer Price Index. The former index relates to households with a monthly expenditure of HK\$100 to HK\$1,999 and the latter, HK\$100 to HK\$599 at the time of the Household Expenditure Survey in 1963–64, based on which weights are derived. This old series was discontinued since 1977 and replaced by the Consumer Price Indexes (A) and (B), and the Hang Seng Consumer Price Index.

The Consumer Price Index (A) and Consumer Price Index (B), compiled monthly by the Census & Statistics Department, are based on the Household Expenditure Survey carried out during the period July 1973 to June 1974. For the Index (A) the weights are derived from the pattern of the households with monthly expenditure between HK\$400 and HK\$1,499, and for the Index (B) between HK\$1,500 and HK\$2,999 at the time of the survey in 1973–74.

The Hang Seng Consumer Price Index, compiled by Hang Seng Bank Ltd. supplements the Consumer Price Indexes (A) and (B). The weights of the Hang Seng Consumer Price Index are derived from the pattern of households with monthly expenditure between HK\$3,000 and HK\$9,999 during the period July 1973 to June 1974.

Figures of household expenditure pattern were obtained from the Household Expenditure Survey 1973-74.

Section 8: ESTIMATES OF GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT

Gross domestic product is an aggregate measure of total value of output produced by residents within the domestic boundary of a country or territory in a specified period, normally a calendar year, before provision for the consumption of fixed capital.

The estimates of gross domestic product presented here were compiled by the Census and Statistics Department using the 'expenditure' approach as the sum of expenditures on consumption, gross domestic capital formation and net exports to the rest of the world. From 1973 onwards, figures for increase in stocks were included.

Private consumption expenditure refers to the value of final expenditure by households and private non-profit making institutions on goods and services. The estimates were compiled mainly using the commodity flow method from extensive data sources including trade statistics, Household Expenditure Surveys, the 1971 Census of Manufacturing Establishments, ad hoc sample surveys and administrative statistics.

Government consumption expenditure refers to expenditure on goods and services by government non-trading departments and is classified into compensation of employees and purchase of goods and other services. Data were obtained from the Treasury.

Gross domestic fixed capital formation refers to the gross value of investment in land; buildings and construction; plant, machinery and equipments.

Expenditure on land is defined as the net expenditure incurred in connection with the transfer of ownership of land and of existing buildings. The estimates were based on stamp duty collected and legal fees charged.

Investment on buildings and construction were based on the Building Ordinance Office's monthly statistical returns, information supplied by concerned construction companies and government accounts.

Investment on plant, machinery and capital was based mainly on the value of retained import of capital goods. For domestically manufactured capital goods, benchmark estimates were derived from the 1971 Census of Manufacturing Establishments.

For increase in stocks, the present estimates cover stocks of materials and supplies, work in progress and finished goods held by industries, and hydrocarbon oils held by importers. Data were obtained from the 1973 Industrial Production Census and a sample of manufacturing establishments, and the Trade, Industry and Customs Department respectively. Due to inavailability of data, stocks of intermediate goods held by wholesalers and retailers are not covered.

Imports and exports of goods and services comprise the value of goods and non-factor services purchased from and sold to the rest of the world.

For import and export of merchandise goods, estimates were based on trade statistics.

The estimates for import and export of transportation, travel and other miscellaneous services were based on a variety of data sources including government accounts, analysis by the Hong Kong Tourist Association and other administrative statistics.

Constant price estimates (base year 1966) were also compiled. They were arrived at by either revaluing at base year prices or by deflating current values by an appropriate price index.

Section 10: MONEY, BANKING AND FINANCE

Money supply and banking statistics are supplied by the Commissioner of Banking.

The banking statistics in Table 10.3 exclude interbank balances within Hong Kong, certificate of indebtedness and the equivalent note issue. The method of computing the average liquidity during the month is prescribed in Section 18 of the Banking Ordinance.

Bank's quoted best lending rate, which refers to the Hongkong & Shanghai Banking Corporation and Chartered Bank's quoted best lending rate for general guidance of other banks, as well as interest rates paid to depositors are supplied by the Hang Seng Bank Ltd.; number and value of bank cheques cleared, by the Hong Kong Bankers' Clearing House.

The inter-bank lending rates are obtained by the Census and Statistics Department from Wah Kiu Yat Po.

Statistics of exchange rates between the Hong Kong dollar and currencies of selected countries are compiled by the Census and Statistics Department from quotations supplied mainly by the Hang Seng Bank Limited. Figures for periods before May 1977 are based on daily closing selling rates of bank-notes and those from May 1977 onwards based on daily closing selling rates of telegraphic transfers. The currencies are selected for those countries which are major trading partners of Hong Kong. The exchange rates of the SDR are derived by multiplying the U.S. dollar value of the SDR as published by the IMF by the appropriate exchange rates of Hong Kong dollar against U.S. dollars as published in the tables. The effective exchange rate index measures movements in the weighted average of nominal exchange rates of Hong Kong dollar against the currencies of 15 principal trading partners. The principal trading partners are selected on the basis of their merchandise trade with Hong Kong and their relative importance in world trade. The weighting system is derived from the trade pattern in 1972. The base date is 18 December 1971 when the Smithsonian Agreement was reached.

Information on companies registered and dissolved and instruments registered is supplied by the Registrar General; and on stock exchange turnover by the Hong Kong Stock Exchange Ltd., the Far East Exchange Ltd., the Kam Ngan Stock Exchange Ltd. and the Kowloon Stock Exchange Ltd. The indexes of share prices are compiled by the Hang Seng Bank Ltd., the Far East Exchange Ltd. and the Kam Ngan Stock Exchange Ltd. The Hang Seng Index refers to transactions in the Hong Kong Stock Exchange Ltd., the Far East Index and the Kam Ngan Index refer to transactions in the Far East Exchange Ltd. and the Kam Ngan Stock Exchange Ltd. respectively.

Section 11: TRANSPORT, COMMUNICATIONS AND TOURISM

Statistics on arrivals and departures of passengers by air, sea and land are compiled by the Immigration Department and refer exclusively to international movements of passengers.

Statistics on aircraft movements and airborne cargoes are taken from the reports of the Civil Aviation Department; on number of ocean-going and other vessels entered and cleared, seaborne cargoes and containers from the Marine Department; on tonnage of cargoes transported by road from the Trade, Industry and Customs Department; and on volumes of goods carried by railway from the Kowloon-Canton Railway.

Statistics about public transport are compiled by the Transport Department.

Statistics on postal services are obtained from the Post Office, and those on international telephone and telegraph services are provided by the Cable and Wireless Limited, while figures about local telephone services are acquired from the Advisory Committee on Telephone Services.

Particulars on incoming tourists and hotels are supplied by the Hong Kong Tourist Association. For incoming tourists, the countries of residence of tourists are used in the classification.

Section 12: BUILDING AND CONSTRUCTION

Statistics on number, area and cost of construction of new buildings are supplied by the Buildings Ordinance Office of Public Works Department. These figures cover the whole of Hong Kong and refer to completed new buildings certified for occupation.

'Usable floor area' is defined as 'the aggregate of the areas of the floor(s) in a storey or a building excluding any staircases, public circulation space, lift landings, lavatories, water closets, kitchens and any space occupied by machinery for any lift, air-conditioning systems or similar service provided for the building'.

'Combined' refers to combined domestic/non-domestic buildings such as apartment/commercial buildings or tenement/

commercial buildings. 'Cost/square feet usable floor area' is calculated from the relevant permits.

Statistics on stock, supply and vacancy position of residential and non-residential premises in Tables 12.4-12.7 are obtained from the Rating and Valuation Department. Figures in these tables relate to private building development in areas where rates are levied and do not cover premises provided by the Hong Kong Housing Authority, the Hong Kong Housing Society or other public works of any kind.

Small tenement floors are independent premises with separate kitchen, lavatory and bathroom having a covered area not

exceeding 450 square feet. Large tenement floors have a covered area of 450 square feet and above.

Small flats are independent premises properly partitioned as living rooms and bedrooms with separate kitchen and bathroom; having a covered area not exceeding 1,000 square feet. Medium flats have a covered area from 1,000 square feet to less than 1,700 square feet while large flats have a covered area of 1,700 square feet and above.

Houses are self-contained western-style house or bungalow designed for single occupation and village-type houses are not

included.

Covered area means the total exclusive use area, measured to the external face of enclosing walls or to the centre line of party walls, including open balconies/verandahs and subsidiary areas such as kitchens, bathrooms, toilets and servants' quarters etc. but excluding common parts such as stairs, lift lobbies, landings etc.

All areas of non-domestic premises are described as internal floor area which means the total exclusive use area of all enclosed space, measured to the internal face of enclosing external or party walls, including internal partitions, but excluding

common parts such as stairs, lift lobbies, other common circulation space etc.

Information on sales of industrial lots is provided by the Crown Lands and Survey Office of Public Works Department and the New Territories Administration.

Section 13: HOUSING

Figures in Tables 13.1 to 13.21 are obtained from the 1961, 1971 & 1976 population censuses.

A living quarter is a dwelling unit used exclusively by one household or shared by a number of households for eating, living and sleeping, internally connected so that the occupants could move between rooms/cubicles without going outside onto a public corridor, landing or staircase, and having direct external access to the street, a corridor, a landing or staircase without going through another household's accommodation.

A room is an area enclosed by a permanent partition going to the height of the ceiling. A cubicle is a space which is enclosed by a partition not going to the height of the ceiling. However, a space divided by curtains or portable screens does not count as a separate room/cubicle. A room/cubicle is one used for living, eating, sleeping or cooking. Bathrooms, toilets and sculleries are therefore not counted as rooms/cubicles.

Figures concerning public housing, cottage and temporary housing areas are supplied by the Housing Department.

Section 17: LAW AND ORDER

Statistics in Tables 17.1 to 17.9 on reported and detected crimes, number of offences and persons prosecuted are supplied by the Royal Hong Kong Police Force.

The method adopted for the counting of crimes is in essence:

- a. for offences against the person one crime is recorded for each person against whom an offence is committed whereas:
- b. for offences against property and offences against public order one crime is counted for each operation, irrespective of the number of victims.

A crime is 'detected' when:

- i. a suspect is arrested and charged with the offence; or
- ii. the offender admits the offence and the offence is 'taken into consideration' (t.i.c.) by the court; or
- iii. the offender has died, or has been committed to a mental hospital before proceedings are instituted; or
- iv. the (juvenile) offender admits the offence but the police exercise discretion not to prosecute.

In cases where an offence has obviously been committed by several people but only one is arrested and charged, the crime is regarded as 'detected'. Also, if a suspect is prosecuted for an offence, it is classified as 'detected' even if he is later acquitted, or if for any reason the prosecution is not proceeded with.

If a person is charged on two or more separate occasions, on each occasion he is counted as a separate person. When a person is charged on the same occasion for two or more offences, one offence only is selected for tabulation, the offence being the one carrying the heaviest maximum penalty.

Statistics relating to courts, magistracies and tribunals are provided by the Judiciary.

Figures of prisoners and inmates detained in prisons, correctional institutions and remand houses are compiled by the Prisons Department.

Number of offenders referred to social enquiry and number of probation orders are provided by the Social Welfare Department.
