2. Demographics - Vital Events

- There were 4 102 600 females and 3 425 300 males in Hong Kong at end-2023, representing increases of 1.0% and 0.5% respectively as compared with end-2022.
- Analysed by age group, the numbers of persons aged 0-14 decreased from end-2022 to end-2023 by 1.9% and 1.4% respectively for females and males.
- Conversely, the numbers of persons aged 65 and over increased by 6.1% and 5.7% respectively for females and males over the same period.



- The expectations of life at birth for females and males in 2023 were 87.9 years and 82.5 years respectively (provisional figures), increasing from 86.8 years and 80.7 years in 2022.

Chart 2.3-A: Number of live births by sex




Chart 2.3-B: Expectation of life at birth by sex





- In 2023, the numbers of never married females and males aged 15 and over were 1 000 100 and 950 500 respectively, representing increases of 3.3% and 3.6% respectively from 2022.
- The numbers of married women and men were 2 036 100 and 1 845 000 respectively in 2023, denoting increases of 2.8% and 2.6% respectively as compared with 2022.
- The numbers of widowed/divorced/separated females and males were 641 700 and 194 000 respectively in 2023, showing an increase of 2.7% and a decrease of 2.6% respectively as compared with 2022.

• The number of marriages rose from 30 012 in 2022 to 47 723 in 2023. The crude marriage rates (i.e. the number of marriages per 1 000 population) for females and males were 11.6 and 13.9 respectively in 2023, higher than the corresponding rates (females: 7.5; males: 8.9) in 2022.

Chart 2.6-A: Number of marriages




Chart 2.6-B: Crude marriage rate by sex



3. Population and Household Characteristics

- During 2011 to 2021, the number of single parents decreased from 81 705 to 72 279, with a 1.2% decrease per annum on average.
- Single mothers far outnumbered single fathers. In 2021, the number of single mothers was 56 249, which was about 3.5 times of the number of single fathers (16 030).
- Comparing with 2011, both the number of single mothers and single fathers declined in 2021. The number of single mothers decreased by 7 791 (or -12.2%), from 64 040 in 2011, whereas that of single fathers dropped by 1 635 (or -9.3%), from 17 665 in 2011.




Chart 3.1: Number of single parents by sex

- The numbers of females and males (excluding foreign domestic helpers) living in subdivided units (SDUs) were 114 034 and 100 170 respectively in 2021, rose from 107 609 and 99 624 in 2016.
- Analysed by sex, among persons living in SDUs, the proportion of females increased from 51.9% in 2016 to 53.2% in 2021, while that of males decreased from 48.1% in 2016 to 46.8% in 2021.

Chart 3.2 : Persons (excluding foreign domestic helpers) living in subdivided units by age group and sex, 2021



Chart 4.1 : Land-based non-institutional population aged 15 and over by educational attainment and sex, 2023



Chart 4.2 : Percentage share of students enrolled in programmes funded by the University Grants Committee (UGC) by level of study and sex, 2023/24



5. Labour Force Characteristics and Employment Earnings

- In 2023, the numbers of economically active females and males aged 15 and over (or the labour force) were 1 921 300 and 1 901 000 respectively. As compared with 2022, the female and male labour force in 2023 increased by 1.6% and 0.8% respectively.
- On the other hand, the numbers of economically inactive females and males aged 15 and over were 1 756 500 and 1 088 600 respectively in 2023.
- Retirement/old age was the most common reason for being economically inactive persons (46.9% of all economically inactive females and 64.2% for their male counterparts).
- While the second most common reason for females was the engagement in household duties (33.5%), that for males was attending educational institutions (20.0%).

Chart 5.1 : Economically inactive persons aged 15 and over by reason for being economically inactive and sex, 2023






Chart 5.2-B: Labour force participation rate by age group and sex, 2023



- In 2023, the numbers of female and male employed persons were 1 874 900 and 1 834 700 respectively, representing respective increases of 2.8% and 2.5% from 2022.
- As the economic activities gradually returned to normalcy, both unemployment rate and underemployment rate continued to decline. Analysed by sex, the unemployment rates for females and males declined from 3.5% and 5.1% respectively in 2022 to 2.4% and 3.5% in 2023.
- On the other hand, the underemployment rates for females and males dropped from 1.9% and 2.8% respectively in 2022 to 0.7% and 1.5% in 2023.



Occupation refers to the kind of work, nature of duties and main task performed by a person in his/her main job during the 7 days before enumeration. It has been enhanced since January to March 2022 to follow the International Standard Classification of Occupations 2008 (ISCO-08) more closely. The above statistics are compiled based on the revised classification scheme. Figures under this classification are not directly comparable to figures under other classifications.

6. Social Welfare

- The number of female CSSA recipients was in general more than that of male recipients. The total number of female CSSA recipients was 148 411 in 2023, higher than their male counterparts of 125 530. Both recorded a decrease as compared with 2022 (females: 155 734; males: 132 204).
- Analysed by type of case, the numbers of female CSSA recipients in the "old age" and "single parent" categories were obviously higher than those of males, mainly due to more elderly females (Table 2.1) and female single parents (Table 3.1) than males.
- In 2023, there were 68 742 and 32 651 female CSSA recipients in "old age" and "single parent" categories respectively, with the corresponding figures of 59 391 and 17 636 for male CSSA recipients.

Chart 6.1 : Recipients of Comprehensive Social Security Assistance (CSSA) by type of case and sex, 2023



Chart 6.2: Persons receiving Social Security Allowance (SSA) by type of scheme and sex, 2023



7. Medical and Health

- The numbers of inpatient and day inpatient discharges and deaths of Hospital Authority (HA) hospitals for females and males were 963 264 and 942 581 respectively (provisional figures) in 2023, representing increases of 16.2% and 16.1% from 2022.
- Besides, the Psychiatry specialist outpatient (clinical) attendances of HA for females rose by 3.9% from 566 314 in 2022 to 588 317 (provisional figure) in 2023, whereas that for males increased by 2.9% from 374 026 in 2022 to 384 917 (provisional figure) in 2023.

Chart 7.1-A: Inpatient and day inpatient discharges and deaths of Hospital Authority (HA) hospitals by sex




Chart 7.1-B: Specialist outpatient (clinical) attendances of Hospital Authority by sex - Psychiatry



In view of the emergence of the Coronavirus Disease 2019 epidemic in Hong Kong since early 2020, HA has adjusted its services in response to the epidemic. This should be taken into account when comparing the throughput of services provided by HA across the years. Chart 7.2 : Standardised cause-specific mortality rate by major cause of death and sex, 2023 g



Chart 7.4: Top ten new cancer cases in males, 2021






Chart 8.2 : Admissions of sentenced persons to correctional institutions by sex





9. Pattern of Participation in Public Affairs

- There were more male than female candidates who stood for election as members of different Government Councils. In the 2021 Legislative Council General Election, the number of male candidates was 126, higher than their female counterparts of 27.
- As for the 2023 District Council Ordinary Election, the number of male candidates was 292, higher than their female counterparts of 108.
- Similarly, the number of male elected members outnumbered female elected members in different Government Councils. In the 2021 Legislative Council General Election, the number of male elected members was 73, higher than their female counterparts of 17.
- As for the 2023 District Council Ordinary Election, the number of male elected members was 187, higher than their female counterparts of 77. On the other hand, the number of male appointed members was 129, higher than their female counterparts of 50.

- In the civil service, the numbers of female and male directorate officers decreased from 572 and 820 respectively in mid-2022 to 561 and 804 in mid-2023.
- Comparing with mid-2022, the proportion of female and male directorate officers in mid-2023 remained unchanged at 41.1% and 58.9% respectively.
- As for non-official members serving on public sector advisory and statutory bodies, the number of females and males decreased from 1 844 and 3 942 respectively in 2022 to 1 797 and 3 827 in 2023.




Chart 9.2: Directorate officers in the civil service by sex

Chart 9.3: Civil servants by sex



10. Information Technology Usage

- For the Internet penetration, among persons aged 10 and over who had used the Internet during the 12 months before enumeration (excluding foreign domestic helpers), there were 3 315 700 females and 3 036 400 males in 2023, denoting increases of 4.0% and 3.0% respectively as compared with 2022.
- In 2023, among persons aged 10 and over who had used personal computer during the 12 months before enumeration (excluding foreign domestic helpers), there were 2 700 200 females and 2 519 200 males, showing increases of 1.8% and 1.0% respectively as compared with 2022.
- As for smartphone penetration, among persons aged 10 and over (excluding foreign domestic helpers), there were 3 340 200 females and 3 037 600 males having a smartphone in 2023, representing increases of 2.4% and 2.1% respectively as compared with 2022.

- A significant increase of 7.3% in the number of persons aged 15 and over (excluding foreign domestic helpers) who had made online purchases for personal matters during the 12 months before enumeration was observed from 2020 to 2022.
- The corresponding number for females rose by 6.7% from 1 449 400 in 2020 to 1 546 500 in 2022, while that for males increased by 7.9% from 1 222 900 to 1 319 600 over the same period.
